2. PROGRESS NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Background

The Harare Slum Upgrading Project running under the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation-funded Global Project on Inclusive Municipal Governance programme is now in year 2. The month of September was characterised by a marked improvement on the superstructure works. On the other hand, there was steady progress on the infrastructure works and this is meant to speed up with plant equipment being dispatched to assist trenching. The month of September also witnessed the finalisation of the finance facility activity with the holding of the pro-poor finance facility workshop. The month also saw the Harare team sending its representatives to the global platform - World Urban Forum in Naples, Italy - an opportunity that showcased the partnership and the slum upgrading project itself on the international scene.

General Progress

The month of September 2012 witnessed significant progress on the houses with construction pace picking up following the delivery of steel reinforcements for lintels and other materials in general. These deliveries saw the lintels being cast and mounted on the houses resulting two units being roofed during the course of the month. The other 14 units are now at different levels of completion and now await roofing. On the infrastructure side, water installation—is now 90% complete whereas preliminary works on sewer have begun. Excavations of sewer is expected to be done by machinery hence it should be able to be completed on time. There was pleasant prgress on storm water and a majority of the pipes that intersect roads have been installed. Meanwhile, excavation of open culverts for storm water is also underway. Besides the works, there was also progress which was registered on activities that are earmarked towards informing policy. For instance, all the the three reports relating to upgrading strategy, review of regulations and finance facility are ready for approval by the relevant—Council committees. In particular, during this month significant inroads

were made with the hosting of the pro-poor finance facility for housing. DIG, which visited during the course of September, also assisted with critical insights that have informed this process.

Key Milestone Deviation and Course Correction

The procurement hitches that have resulted in some delays have been discussed at length during meetings with Crown Agents that were also attended by DIG. These discussions have thus generally improved the procurement exercice thereby further reducing the delivery waiting period. The Harare team and CA have also resolved to work out more ways of ensuring that the entire procurement process is improved. In order to beat these delays and finish by the deadline, the artisans working on the houses have also increased their pace.

Plans for Next Reporting

It is envisaged that the next reporting period will largely focus on the finishes of the houses, sewer works and the resolutions from the Council deliberations on the reports covering upgrading strategy, review of regulations and finance facility. The next reporting period will also focus on year 3 submissions which will include all activities, deliverables and budget.

Risks

The Harare team is monitoring the continued haggling between the political parties over the draft constitution as this might have a bearing on the general political environment in the country. The same applies to the referendum and elections which should naturally follow the process of the draft constitution. Thus, the climate under which all these happen can have an effect on the project hence Harare team is always reflecting on these potential scenarios and their possible consequences. In addition, besides the politics, the Harare team is also constantly assessing on the challenges that rain may bring onto the project as this may delay the project. In order to to get around this potential problem, the artisans have upped their pace and currently concentrating on stages that can be best handled only in dry weather.

Lessons Learned

The month of September had a number of lessons and these were mainly from Activity 8 whereby the Harare team had a reflection session with DIG on the finance facility. The discussions with DIG centred on the role that micro-finance can play within the context of the pro-poor housing finance facility. The reflections highlighted the significance of developing a finance facility that is not only affordable but also sustainable and viable so as to attract funding even locally from the financial sector. Thus, the discussions emphasised the need to explore local sources of funding to complement support from donor agencies.

3. GENERAL BUDGET PROGRESS

The expenditure of the budget is progressing fairly well and the last batch of procurement items is envisaged to consume funds from the last invoices submitted by both COH and DOS.
